**Bill Dowd's 'The Messiah'**

More than 1,600 persons shared Sunday in a musical Christmas gift—the Madison Civic chorus' 17th annual performance of "The Messiah."

Unfortunately, Madison does not have an auditorium capable of holding all who want to hear such fine things as this, so many were turned away—including me. Unfortunately, also, WHA's license does not permit it to broadcast beyond 4:15 p. m. at this time of year, so it could put only the first part of the performance on the air; listeners with FM sets, however, were fortunate in being able to hear all of it on WHA-FM. And station W K O W, whose schedules are often unpredictable, rebroadcast a portion of the program in "The Classical Hour" Sunday night, so listeners who tune in that program regularly and those who chased upon it could get a part of the program, too.

Necessarily, this report on "The Messiah" is woefully inadequate. But listeners present tell me that the impression obtained from radio reception was right—that this was a wholly satisfying performance. The chorus, singing for the first time under the direction of Walter Heerman, had its customary enthusiasm for the music. It was a well-rounded group, and by radio the tenor section sounded particularly good. Virginia Drake, Beaver Dam soprano, gave a most impressive performance; her singing of "I Know That My Redeemer Liveth" was beautifully done, with nice phrasing and clear-cut intonation. Ralph Jackson, "The Sleigh," the Lord" was a fine example of Handelian singing with its long one-word melodies. I did not hear Robert Tottingham's singing and heard only a bit of Anthony Farina's, but others tell me both were good.

Bert Long, Chicago contralto, substituted for Grace Olsen, who was ill. She arrived only five minutes before the performance, and sang without rehearsal; in fact, she had never appeared with Heerman before. But she gave a good account of herself, with a powerful, rounded voice.

The orchestra and Margaret Otterson, in accompaniments, contributed much, too.
