Maker Says '48 Car Buyer Gets a Value

WASHINGTON — (U.P.) — A major automobile maker has said the 1948 car buyer is getting more for his money than before the war.

M. E. Coyle, executive vice president of General Motors Corp., said the man who buys a 1948 Chevrolet list-priced at \$1,280 gets much more for his dollar than the 1929 buyer of a \$1,320 Buick.

His statement was made to a joint congressional subcommittee which is investigating business profits. Coyle followed Charles E. Wilson, president of General Electric Co., who said that more wage increases for labor can result only in higher prices.

"Unless prices are to keep on climbing higher," Wilson said, "wages can be paid only out of the increases."

Coyle said General Motors stockholders have received only 55 per cent of the company's earnings since the war ended, compared with 85 per cent in the years just before the war.

He said the company's actual margin of profit was 8.75 per cent in 1947-48, compared with 11.5 per cent in the 1936-41 period. On top of that, he added, the dollar is worth less and "this is what the stockholder looks at when he considers his 'take home pay.'"

Speechless Child Can Learn to Talk

WICHITA, Kan. — (U.P.) — A speechless child who can produce any type of speech sound intentionally or by accident, can learn to talk, says Prof. Harry J. Helman, an expert in the field of speech correction.

Director of the Syracuse university speech laboratory, Helman cited several cases to support his theory.

He spoke before staff members at the Wichita Institute of Logopedics.

CINCINNATI, O. — (U.P.) — University of Cincinnati sorority girls are foster mothers to a little 12-year-old "Czechoslovakian wait" they have "adopted" for 1949.

The funds which the 16 sororities on the campus have donated for the care of Arna Buckelova will give her food, clothing, medical care and schooling.

Czechoslovakian Arna and her mother spent most of the war years in a concentration camp. The father had been tortured to death at Oswietim concentration camp. The mother's health was broken by her enforced hard labor. Upon liberation they found their home, possessions destroyed.
