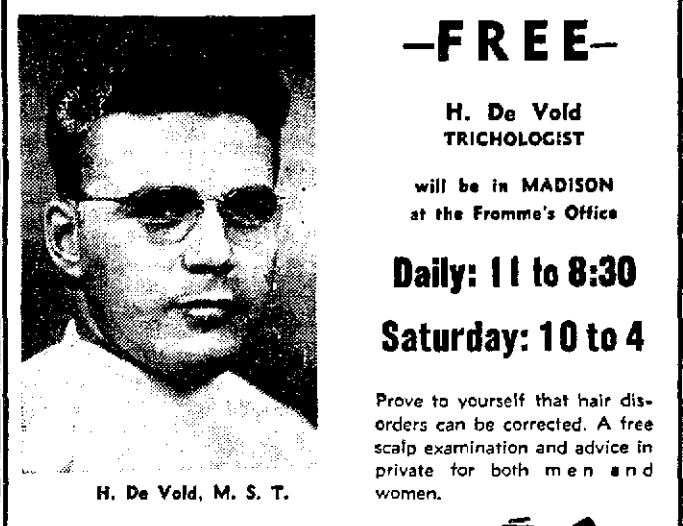
Mental Health Work Ruled Board's Job

The state board of health is the logical place for a state mental health authority, the legislative council agreed today.

The 1947 legislature named the state department of public welfare as the state mental health authority, chiefly for the purpose of receiving federal funds for preventive work with the federal aid.

The council decided, on the advice of its budget subcommittee, against putting any state funds into the mental health setup.
