

Q. How long do contagious germs live on books? What methods are used to destroy them? B. H.

A. The U.S. Public Health Service says that ordinary bacteria will not remain alive on books for more than 30 days. Exposure to drying and sunlight may kill bacteria in a much shorter time. Under unusual con-ditions where the books might remain quite moist, bacteria could survive for a longer pe-riod. This does not refer to certain forms of bacteria, such as anthrax, that go into the spore or seed stage. Such bacteria, however, are almost never found in books.

Q. In what election, prior to 1948, did an elector vote against his state party's candidate? C.

A. This happened in 1820, when one vote was cast against James Monroe by an elector who wanted George Washington to remain the only unanimously elected President.
