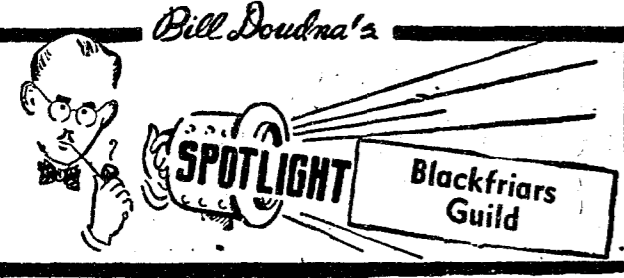


May Be Crosby's Next Leading Lady

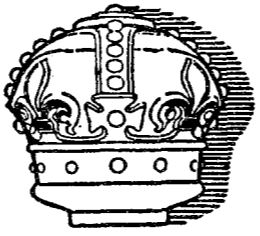
PUNCHBOARDS 'OUT'
