

Half-dozen States Hunt Money to Pay GI Bonuses

HALF a dozen states are searching for money to pay veterans' bonuses. They have to raise about \$495,000,000. Ten other states are paying or preparing to pay \$1,590,256,000 to World War II vets or their survivors.

Indiana bans bonds. A number of suggestions are being considered in Indiana. Among them are proposals to double the gross income tax rate, to tax soft drinks and tobacco, to raise taxes on beer and liquor, to increase the tax on mutual betting.

Iowa voters authorized the state to levy an annual state tax sufficient to retire bonds issued to pay a cash bonus in 1949. The cash commission has certified the levy for this year as \$1.95 per \$100 valuation on real and personal property.
