Q. How much has been paid on the national debt since President Truman took office? R.B.K.

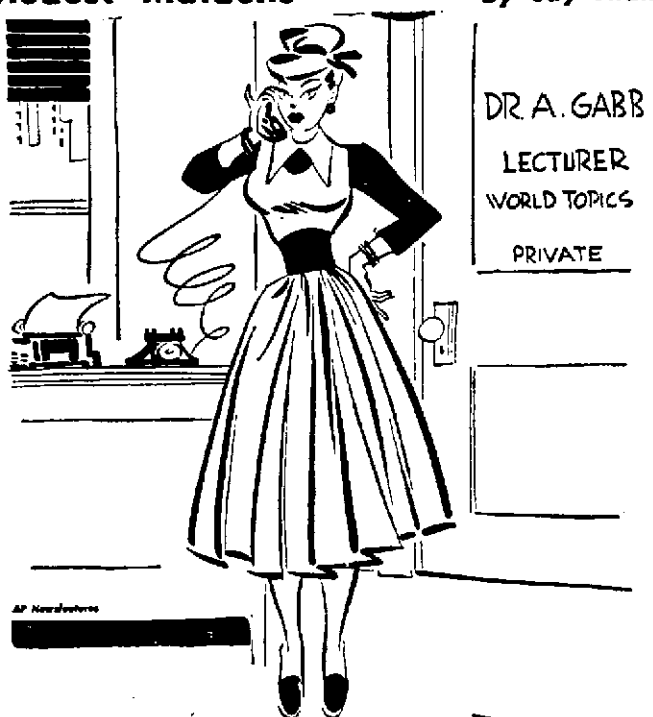

A. Msgr. Edward J. Flanagan, known throughout the world as the father of Boys Town, founded Boys Town in the Christmas season of 1917 by borrowing \$90 to rent a house in Omaha. From that humble start he developed the present institution where hundreds of boys have been given an opportunity to receive training aimed at developing them into useful citizens. Boys Town was incorporated as a village in 1936. Msgr. Nicholas H. Wegner is Father Flanagan's successor.

Q. In what language was the Magna Carta written? C. K. G.

A. The Magna Carta was written in Latin. It was addressed, "To the archbishops, bishops, abbots, earls, barons, justices, foresters, sheriffs, reeves, ministers, and to all bailiffs, and faithful subjects."
