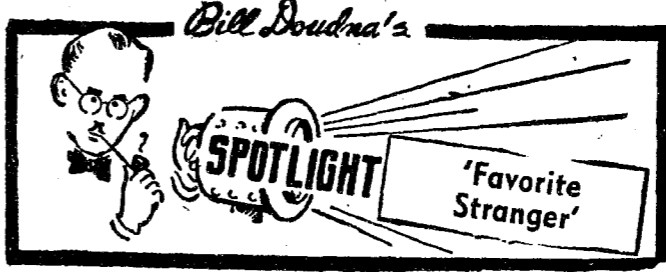

The Railway Express Agency, Inc., would have realized an additional \$32,855 in revenue last year if a proposed rate increase had been in effect, the state Public Service Commission (PSC) was told Tuesday.
