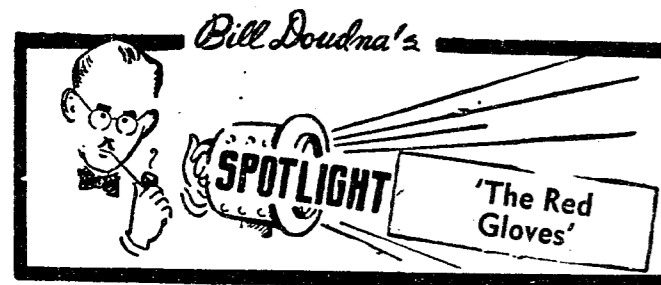


Watching the Birdie

Jean-Paul Sartre manages to stay in the news pretty consistently, whether he's talking about the theater or philosophy, or both. Jack Gaver, United Press drama editor, reports today from New York:

A bi-lingual member of the United Press staff in Paris, who has seen both the original French production of Jean-Paul Sartre's play, 'Les Mains Sales' and the Broadway version, called 'Red Gloves,' sides with the author in disapproval of the latter.

'You could say that in the main the New York production was the same story, but all the finesse of Sartre's lines, which made the play here, are missing,' the correspondent writes. 'It was rather like seeing a dead body.'

It will be recalled that Sartre stirred up quite a trans-Atlantic tempest back in November shortly before the premiere of 'Red Gloves.' He went to court in Paris to get rid of his agent who had arranged the deal whereby Jean Dayrump and Jed Harris got the right to make the American production. Since that time Dan Taradash, the translator-adaptor, has complained in print about interference by Harris, who directed.

The current (March) issue of Theater Arts magazine contains an article by Roderick MacArthur which reports on an interview with Sartre after he finally had obtained and read a copy of the script of 'Red Gloves.'

Originally Sartre had been led to believe from fragmentary reports from friends that the American version had given an anti-Communist twist to his play, which he had claimed was not to be considered as a preachment for either side.

After reading the Taradash version, however, he said 'Red Gloves' actually had a pro-Communist tinge as a result of building up the role of the Communist leader Hoederer so it could be played sympathetically by film star Charles Boyer.

'I asked Sartre,' MacArthur writes, 'if I might roughly classify his original play as anti-Communist since it directly attacked the Communist concept of man as determined by historical environment, and call the New York version, pro-Communist, since Hoederer, modern Communist, seems to win the argument. 'Yes,' said Sartre. 'In that sense my play is a pro-Communist, theirs pro-Communist.'

MacArthur's article quotes Sartre at length, citing chapter and verse of additions and deletions which he alleged wrecked the original concept of his play and the characters therein. Heva squatted as saying that now that the courts have set aside the contract of his agent, he intends to seek an injunction against 'Red Gloves' has been doing good business since its early December opening, largely due to the presence in the cast of Boyer, who received glowing notices from the critics. Their comments on the play itself generally were not pleasant.

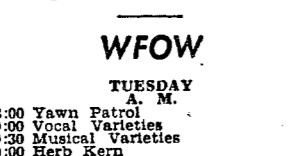

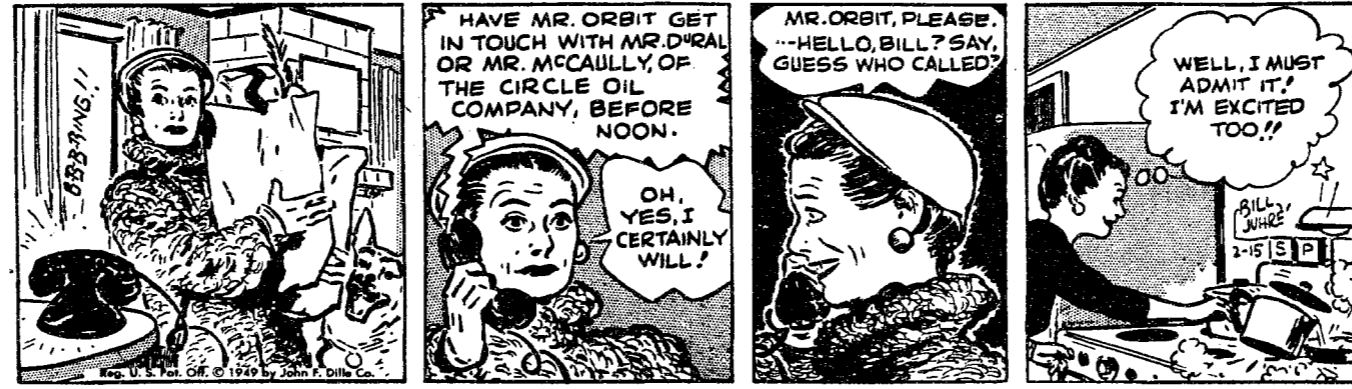

University to Help Czech Unfortunate

GRANVILLE, O. (U.P.)—Students, faculty and friends of Denison university here have all pitched in to help bring to this country a political refugee from Czechoslovakia. They are raising \$1,000 to pay for a one-year fellowship for Dr. Jaroslav Vidla, 30, former department of Charles university in Prague. Dr. Majda escaped in February

after losing his position in the Communist purge in his country. He now is living in a camp for displaced persons in the American zone of Germany.

Dr. Kenneth I. Brown, Denison's president, said the university not only wants to help one of Europe's thousands of unfortunates, but also wants to add to its teaching staff an instructor thoroughly conversant through bitter, personal experience with life in Europe.
