The A Cappella choir also will give a program Friday afternoon at Lincoln junior high school, Kenosha. The university school of music piled up some impressive totals last year in the way of enrollment, students, and outside services by students and faculty, a survey just completed reveals.

Members of the faculty gave or appeared as soloists in more than 40 concerts and recitals, delivered 17 public lectures, assisted five times as guest conductors of other orchestras and bands, and 20 times served as music consultants or judges throughout the state. They turned out 16 original musical compositions and arrangements, some of them major works, and were active in dozens of national musical organizations. Student enrolments were at an all-time high with 709 students (including summer session) enrolled in the school of music proper. In addition, 1,952 students from other schools and colleges on the campus took single courses in the music school. Band, chorus, and orchestra registrations came to 1,239.
