### **Early Day** Stamp Was Ridiculed

Q. WHO DESIGNED the first English postage stamp? N. E.S.

A. William Mulready, an Irish artist, designed the first stamped envelopes. The design was allegorical, covered the entire envelope and met with considerable ridicule. The covers were soon withdrawn and ordered destroyed and so large was the stock that special furnaces had to be built for the purpose.

Q. How deep is the groove made by the recording needle on a phonograph record? E.W. A. The depth of the record groove varies according to pitch. In the case of a record which has 112 lines to the inch, the average depth is from one-thousandth of an inch to twothousandths of one inch.
