It becomes my journalistic duty to tell you there's no truth to the report that Doris Duke has made plans to marry Jay Sims...

I have this from one who feels he knows—Mr. Sims himself. I caught up with Sims at Billy Reed's Little Club.

Sims—a tallish, slim-figured fellow of 38—is in a paradoxical position, if you know what I mean, and I doubt it.

For 17 years since he left the University of Pittsburgh in '32—he's been commenting professionally on the news.

He has always been talking about somebody else. But because he's been frequently in the company of Doris Duke since he happened to meet her in Cincinnati in December—HE'S making news.
