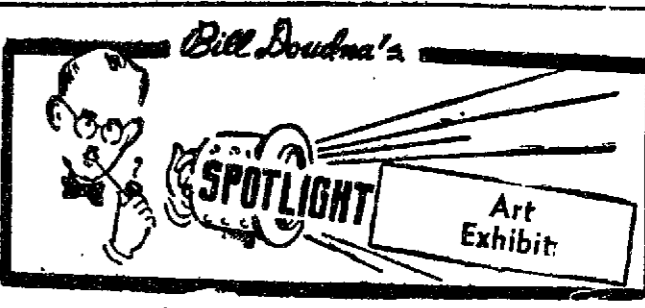

A score of paintings by pupils in Madison public schools is on display at the University of Illinois. Here is a report from the exhibition scene:

URBANA-CHAMPAIGN, Ill.—Probably the most unusual exhibit in the University of Illinois Festival of Contemporary Arts is a group of 20 paintings by 10 to 12-year-old pupils in Madison, Wis., public schools. It is a part of the Allied Arts exhibition in the corridors of Smith Music Hall, Virginia Johnson, art instructor in the Lowell elementary school at Madison and a part-time member of the University of Wisconsin faculty, has approached the subject of painting through the movement of the dance.

To exhibition visitors who exclaim "That's too sophisticated to be the work of children!" "It's amazing," "I can't believe it," "It's a real work of art," Miss Johnson replies. "The amazing thing is the teaching skill of Miss Johnson. Primarily she is teaching rhythms through dances; the painting seems to be a by-product. While some of the pupils are dancing, others sit on the floor and sketch their classmates in various dance postures." Most of the unusual work is done in water colors, although some of the pictures are sketched in colored ink, including pastel shades. One of the selections on exhibition here is done in oil.
