Q. IN WHAT language was the story "Bambi" originally written? E. E.  
A. "Bambi" by Felix Salten, the Austrian author, was originally written in German.

Q. What peoples are included in the term "Gentile" in the Bible? F. B.  
A. The designation "Gentiles" varies in application but in the Old and New Testaments usually includes all nations of the world other than the Jews (Isaiah 49:6; Romans 2:14; 3:29). The Revisers very often substitute for "Gentiles" the word "nations." At times "Gentiles" is a synonym for "Greeks" and in certain passages it stands in contrast to "Christians." The Hebrews call the "Gentiles" by the general name of Goyim, which signified the nation that have not received the faith, or law of God.

Q. Has the height of the earth's atmosphere been definitely fixed? E. M. E.  
A. The exact height has not been established. The atmosphere is believed to reach several hundred miles above the surface of the earth. The slice of atmosphere in which we live is barely 1-100 the thickness of the atmosphere as a whole.

Q. What is the origin of spitting for luck? V. J. S.  
A. Among the ancient Greeks and Romans spitting was a charm against enchantment. Pliny said it averted witchcraft and availed in conquering an enemy.

Q. What is the fastest time recorded for firing five shots from a double-action revolver, either professional or amateur? P. M. T.  
A. The United States Revolver Association says that McGivern of Montana fired five shots from the Smith & Wesson .38 Special, with an electric timer certified by the National Bureau of Standards, in 9.20th of a second. This was the fastest of many strings reported by Col. D. B. Wesson in his book, "Burning Powder."

### Food Store Chain Heir Finds Artists' Haven

NEW YORK, AP—"When a young artist gets out of college," said Huntington Hartford, "he ought to work at it." "He ought to sit down and paint, or compose. But how can he if he has to look for a job? How can he write novels or sculpt heads if he is tied to a filling station five days a week?"  
Huntington Hartford is going to do something about that. Young Hartford is the heir to the A. & P. grocery fortune. He is 37. He has more than a million in annual income of his own.  
In his younger days he wanted to be a reporter, and found out that too much money is almost as bad as too little.  
So he says he plans to endow, through the Huntington Hartford Foundation, not a school for geniuses, as was reported, but a place where the up-and-comers of today can go instead

of killing their incentive in corner garages.  
As he plans it, his sanctuary will have about 150 acres in the Santa Monica Mountains of California. There will be cabins with sound-proofed walls for composers. The painters will have plenty of light. There will be all the necessary tools for writers.  
"We have 41 acres in Rustic Canyon and plan to get about 110 acres more. It's wild country, full of giant oaks and sycamores. The Will Rogers Memorial Park is nearby. There are a number of all-metal buildings on the place."  
"There used to be a kind of religious cult there. It folded. On the place next to it, the place I'm trying to buy, there's a model farm with an Early American home and fine roads. The house is constructed at angles and a trout stream runs right through it."  
Hartford said he had retained the architect son of Architect Frank Lloyd Wright to put up about 20 buildings.  
"Our little community will be complete in itself. There will be a large dining room, with motion pictures. The University of California at Los Angeles is

One modest black and white advertisement inserted once brought bigger returns than those of rival products using a large colored display repeated over a long period because the smaller ad had the right slogan. They also found if an ad does not bring early returns, repetition is practically wasted money.

### Smoke in the Eyes

THE MEN from Mars invaded Ecuador with more tragic consequences than when Orson Welles' famous broadcast sent people fleeing into the country from his Martian invaders. The terrible vengeance which an angry mob in Quito, Ecuador, took when they discovered they had been hoodwinked into panic by a radio dramatization of H. G. Wells' "War of the Worlds" is not pleasant to read about. To unleash the dogs of war, even for a fictional frolic, is risky business.  
War, like fire, is not something to be played with, especially as Welshian fantasy and sober fact draw closer together. The current crop of American novels has done a useful job in taking out of war the last vestiges of glamour left over from World War I. But you can't scare people out of war; you can't even depress them out of it. You can only show them that the raw material of war is in individual thinking, where the smoldering stuff of fear and

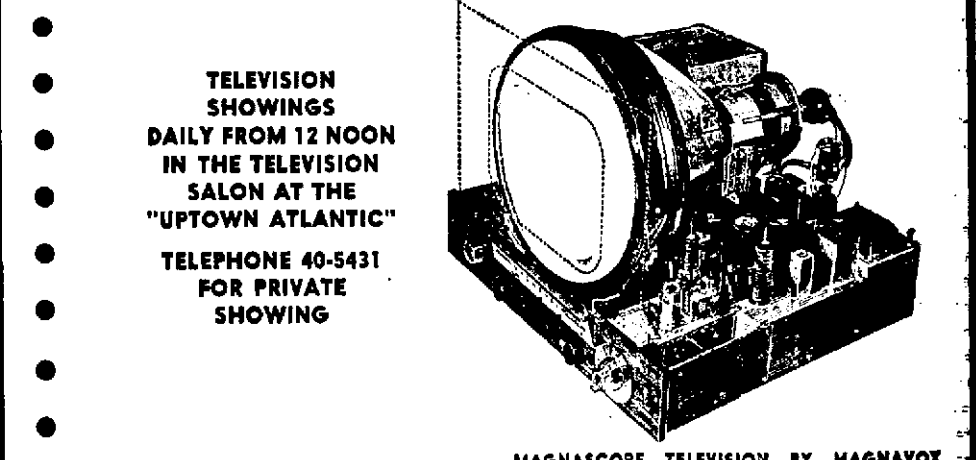
