

Prof. Oskar F. L. Hagen's "Suite for String Quartet" had its first performance Sunday night at Music hall, with the Pro Arte quartet performing the five-movement work. The composer had described it as "definitely non-de-scriptive." While that was his in-

tent, the suite didn't come out that way.

Except for one movement, it was quite certainly "program music"—that is, music which paints a picture or tells a story. Hagen's

sic"—that is, music which paints a picture or tells a story. Hagen's impressionistic writing, in several instances, took his work out of the abstract into the concrete.

This was particularly true of the fourth movement, which he described as "the musical sublimation" or "moonlit nights" in a rural Wisconsin summer. Muted strings, harmonics, and closelytuned harmonies in the upper range did more than "sublimate" such impressions; they detailed them.

The one movement which appeared to meet the composer's own definition was the third, "animals gamboling in pastures." It "10. Add 10.35 and 1
