Court Cuts Term of Soldier's Killer

WISBADEN, Germany — (U.P.)
—A United States military court
Monday reduced to five years the
20-year prison term to which Mrs.
Wilma Ybarbo, 23, Malden, Mass. was sentenced last December for the fatal shooting of her husband, Sgt. John Ybarbo, after a GIfraulein party in her home.

Mrs. Ybarbo was tried under both German and military government law. The court found for she was not subject to military in

In lightening the sentence, the court decided the shooting of Ybarbo, from Goliad, Tex., was the result of a "long and intolerable course of cruelty and ill-treatment by the soldier-husband." government law and said all
