Q. Are there any living descendants of Christopher Columbus? H. Z.

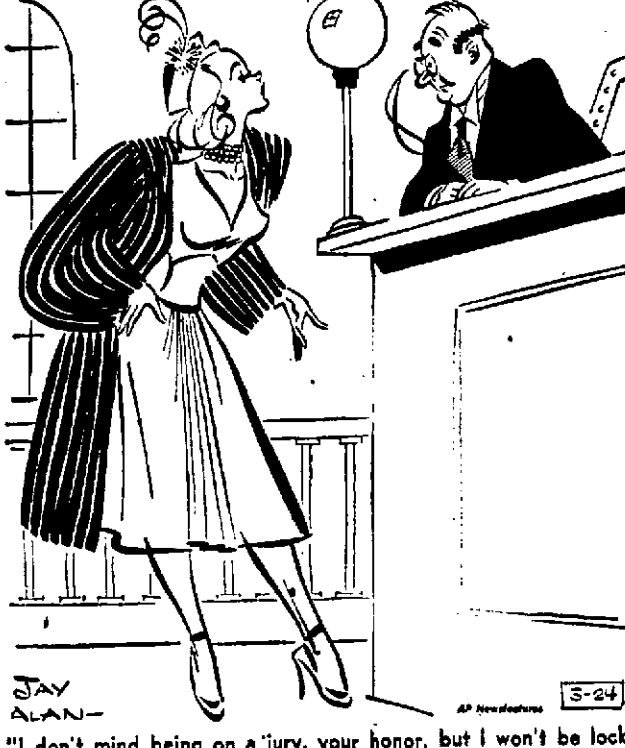
A. The Spanish Duke of Veragua is a descendant of Columbus' line. There are said to be several families in South America who trace their ancestral lines to the Admiral.

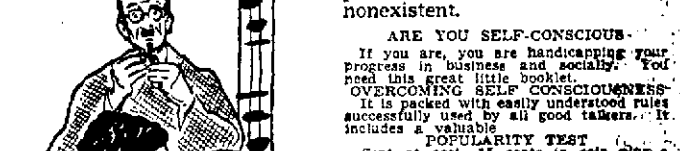

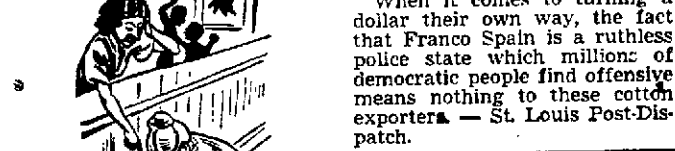
