Q. WHICH INSECTS are harmful and which are beneficial to man?-J. C.

A. Insects such as the grasshopper, locust, cotton boll weevil, plant lice, etc., do an immense amount of damage, estimated at \$2 million annually. Beetles, wasps, and other insects destroy large numbers of harmful insects which would overrun gardens and fields. Countless scavenger insects help the bacteria in getting rid of refuse. Among all the insects, men have domesticated only two with profit—the honey bee and the silk worm.


