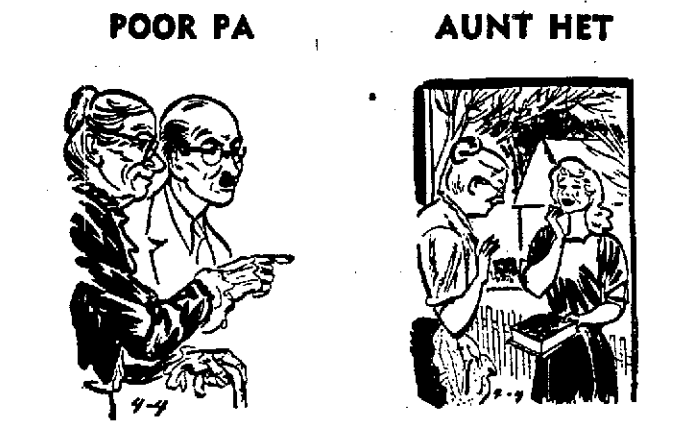

Ten Leading U. S. Cattle States Listed

By HASKIN A reader sent the answer to my question of fact by writing the Long Beach Press-Telegram Information Bureau...

Q. WHICH ARE the leading cattle states? H. J. H. A. The Department of Agriculture says that the 10 leading states in total cattle production, reported Jan. 1, 1948, were: Texas, Iowa, Nebraska, Wisconsin, Kansas, Minnesota, Illinois, Missouri, California, South Dakota.

Q. Do flowers live longer if an aspirin tablet is dissolved in the water in which the stems are placed? C. H. B.

A. Experiments by government experts have to far demonstrated that there is no particular value in the addition of aspirin to the water. When a half tablet of aspirin was added to 500 cubic centimeters of water, the flowers were found to have withered over night. The leaves were completely dried up. Flowers that had been immersed in a solution of one-quarter tablet of aspirin to 500 c. c. of water were not as fresh as those that had been placed in plain water.

Q. How long are the roots of ordinary field corn? J. S. A. In good corn soil the lateral corn roots are about 3 1/2 feet in length; those growing downward are usually five to six feet, sometimes running to the depth of seven or eight feet, depending on the soil.

Q. Who originated the saying, "While there is life there is hope"? A. C. S. A. The saying has been used by many persons. Cicero (106-43 B.C.), the Roman orator, in his "Epistolae ad Atticum" remarked, "Dum anima est, spes est."

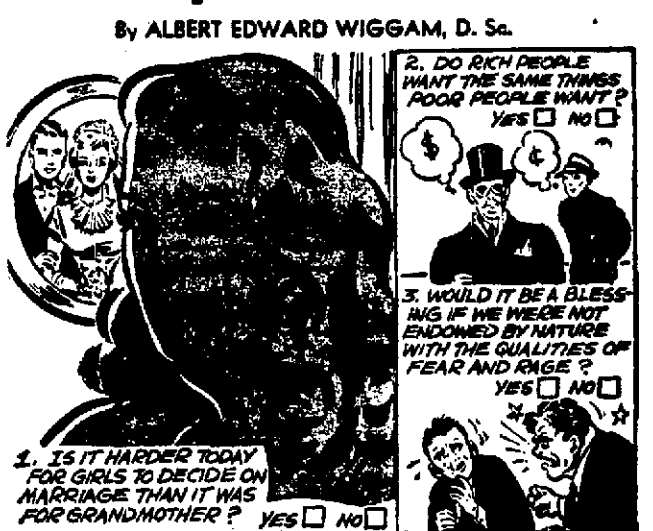
