

Flowers that had been immersed in a solution of one-manuscript to 500. quarter tablet of aspirin to 500 c. c. of water were not as fresh as those that had been placed in plain water. A slight addition of salt to the water tends to keep cut flowers a little longer. The stems should be clipped each day under water.




