Madison, the year-round Chautauqua, had more attractions Sunday than one could well handle—symphony, quartet, and choral concert and an art show opening. This department chose the Madison Civic Symphony orchestra at 3:30 and the Pro Arte quartet at 8 p. m. Meanwhile, another reporter covered the Madison Art guild's annual exhibition. The Carthage College choir sang at Luther Memorial church.

Walter Heermann, conductor of the Civic Symphony, played a double role at the orchestra concert in the Masonic auditorium, appearing as cellist as well as director. He joined his brother, violinist Emil Heermann of Cincinnati, and the orchestra in the Brahms double concerto for violin and cello. Concertmaster Marie Endres took the baton for the number.

The Heermanns made a fine team for the difficult and beautiful music, and Miss Endres conducted with vigor and precision, building up some outstanding climaxes. Heermann showed up with brilliant singing tones, and their interplay of melody was a delight. One could wish devoutly, however, for an auditorium more closely suited to the music, for space requirements placed the soloists below the orchestra as well as in front of it, and this hampered the exchanges of music which are an important factor in the concerto's beauty.

The audience of 1,100 listeners gave them hearty applause, as it did the other soloist, Rosetta Matrose.

Miss Matrose, a young Chicago soprano, showed considerable promise in her singing of the "Adeste Fideles" from "Tristan and Isolde." She had a clear, rounded voice with great potential power. The orchestra opened the program with a joyous playing of Brahms' "Academic Festival" overture, and also performed the "Tristan and Isolde" prelude and two Debussy nocturnes, "Cloude" and "Festivals."

Under Heermann's direction, it gave the prelude surging beauty, with a keen feeling for the sensuousness of Wagner's music. There were times at which Debussy's "Cloude" became somewhat heavier than the Corol-like kind one expects, but the second nocturne more than met expectations, with full emergence of the piece's pagantry.

The Pro Arte quartet ended its program with as fine a performance of a Beethoven quartet as has ever given. The choice was the C-major (Opus 59, No. 3), whose second movement is a full of tender melodies that one wonders how one mind could encompass them. Every man in the group seemed especially inspired; perhaps it's the spring.

The program included the first performance of Hilma Luckhardt's "Duo for Violin and Piano."
