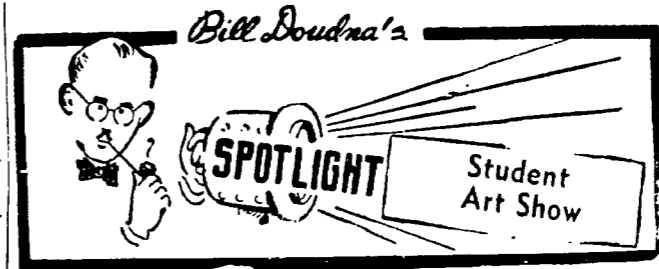

A total of 153 art works by University of Wisconsin students went on display Thursday at the Memorial Union after \$535 in prizes.

The paintings, sculptures, graphics, ceramics, photographs, and art metal pieces, comprise the 21st annual Student Art show, which will remain on display through May 3.

The show, sponsored by the Wisconsin Union gallery committee, attracted 310 entries.

The prize winners and the other works being shown were chosen by a jury consisting of Alonzo Hauser, Macalester college; Gabriel Jones, Lawrence college; and Walter Quirt, University of Minnesota.

They first chose 38 pieces as outstanding, then distributed the awards among these entries.

Many of these were purchased prizes, but in some cases the artist was not willing to sell his work for the amount available.

hence he received an award but no purchase price. In others, however, the student received an amount greater than the value he had set.

The jury found no sculpture worthy of a merit award, but one piece received a purchase prize.

The trio said, however, that "we consider the general standard of entries to be very high. There is apparently little direct influence from various styles and 'isms' usually dominating student shows."
