If Theater Is Criterion, Japan Still Far Off Beam

IT'S MY BELIEF that the state of a nation's show business is a sure-shot index to the state of the nation itself, and that the fastest way to get a line on what goes on in people's heads is to have a look at the types of entertainment they patronize. And so, during my seven days in Japan, I gave its stages and screens a careful peek-see, paying particular attention to what the audiences reacted to what they saw and heard.

And so back to my getaway sentence—that the state of a nation's show business is an index to the state of the nation. As I see it, the Japanese, like their theater, are straddling history, with one foot in the 15th Century and the other in America, and they're still trying to get by with ideologies and ideas which have cooled down a lot since they burned up the Middle Ages. Besides which, if there's anything to the theory that it's healthy for people to have a theater where they can take an honest look at themselves, then the Japanese are plenty sick, because the images that the theatrical syndicates are showing them make them look like Hollywood chorus girls or feudal puppets.

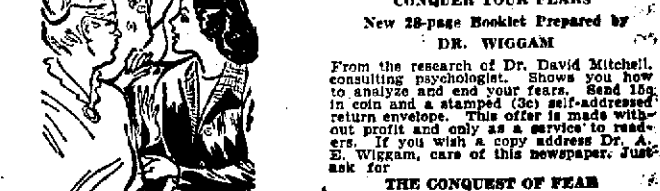
