

living.

her story, and loses her mind completely when the brother-in-law attacks her. Anthony Quinn's performance as the sister's husband was up to the level of Miss Hagen's. His drunken attack on his pregnant wife, his utter scorn for her sister, his uninhibited caresses—everything he did was completely cred-

Russell Hardie, as the man Blanche loves, had high moments too, particularly in his bashful acceptance of her demand for bur-lesque homage and in his patient declaration of love. Mary Welch, as the sister, was somewhat less believable, and the rest of the cast, most of them with little to

do, fared well.



The play will be repeated tonight and Wednesday atternoon and night. Last word from the boxoffice said that the night performances are sold out, but that a few matinee seats remain.




