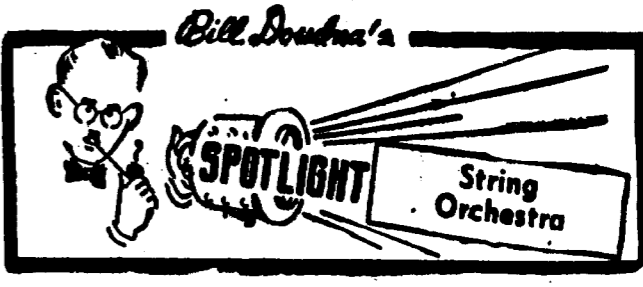

Marie Endres' Wisconsin School of Music String orchestra gave out with an enjoyable 90 minutes of music Wednesday night at Central high school, playing for the benefit of the Kiddle camp fund. The orchestra, composed largely of high school and college age musicians, showed Miss Endres' great care in training, yet played with the liveliness and vim of youth. The first half of the program was much the better, for the youngsters in the group showed signs of fatigue in the second part. Highlight of the evening was a lucid, telling performance of Williams' "Fantasia on a Theme by Thomas Tallis," with its remarkable instrumental effects, achieved in part by a separation of the group into two sections. Noteworthy were the solo roles of John Fredrickson, violin; Marvel Gasser, viola, and Jacquelyn Dougan, cello. Fredrickson's clarity of tone added, too, to the enjoyment of Delius' introspective "Air and Dance." Alan Shulman's "A Nocturne for Strings" was a strangely engaging piece, and Beethoven's "Country Dance" got a jolly playing. For encores, there were a Tchaikovsky "Humoresque" and a repetition of "The Bee."

ASIDE TO PARENTS: Some mothers and fathers need to give a few lessons in concert-going manners to their offspring. A half-dozen sub-teen-age girls in the front row of the balcony made themselves constantly annoying Wednesday night, not even stopping their antics at the request of a girl sitting behind them. These youngsters were the exception rather than the rule; most boys and girls are civil to the artists and to the rest of the audience.

AWARDS: The annual awards of honors by Madison's theater critics will be made to Wisconsin Players actors and backstage workers at the organization's annual dinner tonight. PAINTINGS: An exhibit of water colors and oils by two University of Wisconsin graduate art education students is on display this week in room 110, Art Education bldg. The artists are Harold White, State college, Penn., and Oleg Kondrat, Chicago. White has received degrees at Pennsylvania State college of the School of Design, Providence, R. I. He spent 1948 as art director of the Institute for Research and Social Science at North Carolina university. Two of his paintings were shown in the North Carolina and Virginia Oil and Water Color show in 1947. White will receive his master's degree in applied arts next month. Kondrat's scenes of Guatemala, exhibited recently in Madison shows, where painted while he was on vacation in 1947. Some of his paintings recently were shown in the Latin American crafts exhibit at the Memorial Union. Kondrat is a graduate of the University of Wisconsin and of the Chicago Academy of Fine Arts, which he attended under a scholarship. He has been active in art work on the Badger and is doing graduate work in applied arts.
