Q. DID World War II records show that more boys than girls were born during the war period? I. M. P.

A. A study of births in the United States and Canada during the war period showed a small increase in the number of boys born, but it was so small as to be considered negligible from the layman's viewpoint. The idea that more boys are born during a war than normally probably was based on World War I figures for certain European countries. Even these figures are not considered to be large enough to support this belief entirely.

Q. What President of the United States was a Sunday School teacher? E. C.

A. William Henry Harrison taught a Sunday School class in a small church near the banks of the Ohio until his election as President of the United States.

Q. How large are new born corybas? Are they poisonous from the time of birth? G. D. L.

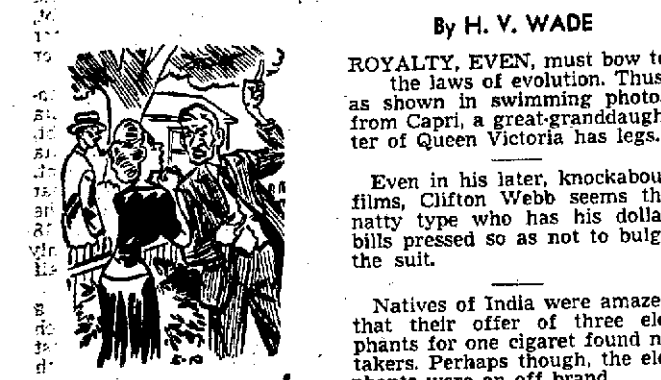
Answer to Question No. 2

No. On the decline. Surgeon Gen. L. A. Scheele of the U. S. Public Health Service states in a special bulletin of April 4, 1948, "The number of divorces has taken a sharp dip in the last two years. There were about one-third fewer divorces in 1948 than in the peak year, 1946, when it is estimated 610,000 divorces were granted." In 1947 there were only about 474,000 divorces and about 415,000 in 1948. The rate of decline was from 4.3 per 1000 population in 1946,
