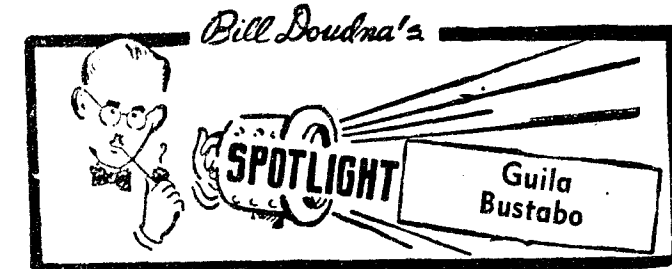

Wisconsin's contributions to the concert field—Guila Bustabo in Madison last week, and was thrilled at playing for Gov. Rennebohm. She performed the wedding party of Mr. and Mrs. Ralph Ammon, with Gov. and Mrs. Rennebohm among the guests.

It had been planned as a garden party, but unseasonably cold weather forced the guests indoors. Miss Bustabo insisted, however, on doing one number outside anyway, "because it was so beautiful," and found the birds in the trees singing along with her playing of the last movement of the Mendelssohn concerto.

Miss Bustabo, a native of Manitowish, was one of the stars of the grandstand show at the Wisconsin Centennial exposition, where 180,000 persons heard her in 14 consecutive appearances.

At 5, the violinist was playing with a picked group from the Chicago Symphony orchestra, and a month later she won her first scholarship. And she won scholarships again every year for the next five years.

After appearances with major symphony orchestras in this country, she went to Europe, playing in England, Holland, France, Italy, Germany, and the Scandinavian countries, and then in Australia. She uses a Guarnerius violin, whose estimated value is \$75,000.

"Guila Bustabo," says the magazine Violins and Violinists, "has the honor of being the only American violinist who has ever composed or had dedicated to her a violin concerto by an Italian opera composer."

"The concerto... developed, with Miss Bustabo's collaboration, from an 18-minute sketch" composed by Ermanno Wolf-Ferrari.
