Following is the Department of Agriculture recipe which makes about six pints: Ingredients: 4 pounds prepared thick watermelon rind; limewater made with 2 quarts cold water and 1 tablespoon of lime (calcium oxide purchased from drug store); 2 tablespoons whole allspice; 2 tablespoons whole cloves; 10 two-inch pieces of stick cinnamon; I quart vinegar; 1 quart water; 4 pounds sugar. To make: Select thick rind from a firm, but not overripe melo Trim off the green skin and pink flesh. Weigh 4 pounds of the prepared rind and cut in inch pieces ak for 1 hour in limewater to make the rind firm. Drain, cover with fresh water, and cook 11/2 hours or until tender. Add more Sen. Soaper Says: water as needed. Drain. Put spices loosely in a thin, clean white cloth and tie top tightly. Put this spice bag in a kettle with vinegar, sugar and 1 quart water. Bring to boiling. Add the watermelon rind and boil gently 2 hours. Remove the spice bag. Pack the rind in clean, hot sterile jars which will seal tight. Fill jars to top with hot sirup. Seal tightly.
