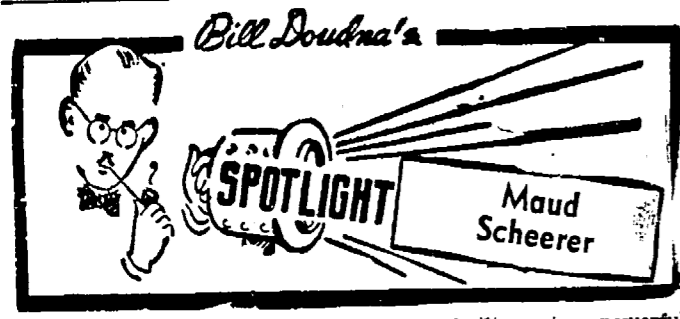

As she had promised, Maud Scheerer built up two powerful characters in her reading of Maxwell Anderson's "Anne of the Thousand Days" at the Wisconsin Union theater Thursday night. They were Anne Boleyn and Henry VIII. And, as Miss Scheerer had said in her preface, Anderson had used his drama of the past to point a moral for the present or to mark a path for the future. He told the story of Anne's thousand days as Henry's wife in a straight-forward way, eschewing flights of eloquence in favor of hard-hitting, but nevertheless poetic prose. Miss Scheerer, through Anderson's lines and her vital delivery of them, built up Henry as a man

lost love, she had regrets; for her acts, little. Miss Scheerer will repeat the reading at 8 tonight and at 8 p. m. Saturday in the same theater. Theatergoers Thursday night found her less assured and with a less positive control of her voice than in previous years — but possessor of a remarkable ability to make one see the people and the settings of the play.
