**SPOTLIGHT**  
Honors for Schempf

William H. Schempf, graduate of Madison West high school and the University of Wisconsin, is one of the first recipients of the Alfred Noble Robinson award of \$1,000 given at Lehigh university. He graduated from West in 1935 and from the university in 1939.  
Schempf is assistant professor of music at the Bethlehem school. The award is given annually to a member or members of the Lehigh university faculty under 35 years of age and below the rank of associate professor.  
Schempf will share the award with John Karakash. It was set up by Brig. Gen. Alfred R. Glancy, vice-president of General Motors Corp.

**SCHOLARSHIPS:** Girls won seven of the 10 University of Wisconsin competitive scholarships for 1949 graduates of Wisconsin high schools who attended this summer's music clinic. Prof. L. L. Itin, chairman of the clinic, announced Tuesday.  
These scholarships, created by the board of regents, may be applied to any department of the university and exempt the students from paying \$51.50 of the general fee for each semester. They are renewable each of the four college years, provided the holder maintains a C yearly average in all subjects and is a member of one university musical organization.  
Three of the scholarships were awarded students attending the All-State Band in the first half of the clinic and have been announced previously.  
The boys and girls scheduled to take part in the All-State orchestra and chorus sections had a try at the exams even though the second half of the clinic was cancelled due to an outbreak of polio.

## China Nationalists Start Packing for Move to Chungking

CANTON — (AP) — The government is hastily packing the official archives for the long, sad journey back to Chungking, the wartime capital, sources revealed Wednesday.  
Little more than three years ago, Chiang Kai-shek and his government triumphantly moved out of that far western city and returned to Nanking, Japan was beaten.  
Now another of Chiang's old enemies, the Chinese Communist, threatens. Red armies are little more than 200 miles to the north. The Red advance has put two provincial governments to flight. The Kiangsi province government fled from menaced Kankhsien to Hweichang. Kankhsien is 215 miles northeast of Canton. Hweichang is 50 miles southeast of Kankhsien. The Hunan province government, in the path of the main Red advance, has cleared out to Chihkiang. That is 280 miles northwest of Canton.  
The gloom is thick in this refuge capital deep in south China. Few believe Canton will remain the Nationalist capital much longer. Six weeks at the most, say some.  
Some officials already have gone to Chungking. Others have left for Taipei, capital of the island fortress of Formosa.  
Unless plans are changed, Chungking again will become the Nationalist capital. But the seat of Nationalist power — as everyone knows — will remain with Chiang at Formosa.
