Resting at Chicago, Hoover Says He's Fully Recovered

CHICAGO (AP)—Former President Herbert Hoover indicated Sunday he was recovered from a mild gall bladder attack that struck him while he was aboard a transcontinental train. Hoover, who has no physical complaints, is smilingly told newsmen as his train reached Chicago.

"My complaints are moral, political, and economic," he declined to elaborate on his other complaints as he hustled into a limousine and went to a hotel for a brief rest, before continuing his journey from San Francisco to New York.

The 75-year-old only living ex-president was stricken with the gall bladder attack—an old ailment—while his train was crossing Nevada early Saturday.

He said he didn't consider his trouble serious and that it was the first attack he'd had in three years.

"As a matter of fact, I won 32 cents at gin-rummy. That should be sign of recovery, shouldn't it?" he asked.

GENERAL ORDER 124
STATE OF WISCONSIN REG. DEPT. OF HEALTH

In the Matter of Standards and Regulations for Milk and Cream as Food for Man.

Whereas having been held in accordance with the provisions of section 8.18 of the Wisconsin Statutes after notice published as required by law, and a transcript of the evidence presented at such hearing, including the findings and conclusions of fact and conclusions of law, and the reasons therefor, pursuant to the above entitled hearing, the following minimum standards and regulations for milk and cream shall, on and after the 15th day of November, 1949, apply to all milk and cream sold or exposed for sale or held in possession with intent to sell for food or to be processed into food for man, and to all methods and procedures used in the production and processing of such milk or cream in Wisconsin:

FARM INSPECTION.
1. Every producer of milk and cream shall permit the operator or authorized fieldman of the department to which he is then delivering his milk or cream to make an inspection of his premises and the milk and cream, or when the premises are found to be in compliance with the minimum production requirements as herein provided.

1.02 Each such inspection a copy of an accurately completed inspection report shall be furnished to the producer and he shall promptly undertake the correction of the conditions which are in violation of the minimum production requirements as herein provided.

1.03 The inspection of the producer's premises shall mean and include the examination of inspection of the premises as defined in paragraphs 1.04 to 1.18 and the checking thereof on the basis of the minimum requirements therein provided.

1.04 Cows. All milk and the cream produced therefrom shall be drawn from clean healthy cows.

1.05 Personnel. Only clean and healthy persons shall be permitted to milk the cows and to handle the milk or cream.

1.06 Stalls. The floors and walls of all dairy barns where cows are milked shall be constructed of concrete or other approved impervious and easily cleaned material. They shall be clean and free of manure, dirt and other objectionable material. They shall be kept clean and free of manure, dirt and other objectionable material as often as necessary to keep them in a sanitary condition.

1.07 Milk. The milk shall be drawn from clean healthy cows and shall be provided with sufficient light properly distributed throughout the milking process so as to avoid overcrowding. No water shall be permitted in the milking stable. All manure shall be removed from the milking stable and disposed of in such a manner as to be inaccessible to the milking process.

1.08 Cow Yard. The cow yard shall be well drained and properly graded so as to be free from standing pools of water. It shall be kept free from manure and dirt and shall be kept clean and free of manure, dirt and other objectionable material.

1.09 Tolerances. All tolerances on every quart of milk shall be as follows:

(a) Total solids not less than 8.5 percent.

(b) Fat not less than 3.5 percent.

(c) Acidimetric acidity not more than 0.18 percent.

(d) Water supply. An adequate supply of clean water shall be provided for the dairy herd and for the cleaning of dairy utensils and equipment.

1.11 Milk Utensils. All milk utensils used in the production, handling or storage of milk shall be made of material which is non-toxic and shall be kept clean and free of manure, dirt and other objectionable material.

1.12 Utensil Cleaning. All milk utensils and equipment shall be fitted with clean water immediately after use. They shall be washed clean with water and a suitable dairy cleaning solution.

1.13 Following this they shall be rinsed with clean water and placed on a sanitary rack. Just before again being put into use, all such utensils shall be rinsed with clean fresh water containing a trace of chlorine.

1.14 This solution shall be of an effective strength. This sanitizing treatment is not required when other effective sterilization has been applied.

1.15 Usual Storage. All utensils used in the production, handling or storage of milk shall be stored in a clean, well-ventilated, enclosed structure in such a manner as to protect them from contamination by any other milk or cream coming in contact with them or which comes in contact with them on a suitable rack. The bottom boards of the rack shall be high enough to avoid contamination from

enough to avoid contamination from the floor.

1.16 Milking. The flanks, bellies and udders of all cows shall be clean and free of dirt at the time of milking. The udder and teats of all milking cows shall be washed immediately before milking with a clean cloth or other approved material dipped in a sanitizing solution resistant for that purpose. Washwater or sprays can be substituted if udder and teats are washed immediately before milking.

1.17 All persons milking shall be kept out of the milk supply. The milker's hands shall be washed clean with water and the udder and teats of the cow shall be washed clean with water and a suitable dairy cleaning solution.

1.19 Milk House. Three years after the effective date of this regulation every producer of milk or cream shall have available for use on his premises a building or structure equipped with cooling tank and utensils and equipment suitable for the production of milk or cream. The building or structure shall be adapted to the specific requirements of the market to which the milk or cream is to be transported.

2. MILK AND CREAM TRANSPORTATION.

2.01 Every vehicle used to transport milk or cream from producers to any other place shall be equipped with a cooling tank and utensils and equipment suitable for the production of milk or cream. The building or structure shall be adapted to the specific requirements of the market to which the milk or cream is to be transported.

2.02 When skim milk, buttermilk or whey is being transported to the producer's farm, the producer shall use a clean and sanitary container for such milk or cream. Such container shall be equipped with a cooling tank and utensils and equipment suitable for the production of milk or cream. The building or structure shall be adapted to the specific requirements of the market to which the milk or cream is to be transported.

2.03 An inspection report of the type prescribed by the Department shall be made by the inspector at the time of each inspection. Such report shall include at least the following information:

(a) The name of the producer.

(b) The name of the inspector.

(c) The results of such tests and examinations.

(d) The name of the milk or cream of each patron sampled and the cause of any non-compliance.

(e) A monthly summary of the tests made showing the number of samples of milk or cream which are in compliance with the minimum production requirements and the number of samples which are not in compliance.

(f) The name of every dairy plant receiving milk or cream directly from the producer and the name of each patron from whom such milk or cream is received.
