Bill Doudna's SPOTLIGHT Football On the Air

Radio coverage of the 1949 high school and college football season will start tonight, but you'll have to have a frequency modulation (FM) set to get in on it. WFOW will carry the Madison Central-Sheboygan Central game at 8. The station will record the first half of the tilt, which will start at 7:30, but hopes to be able to catch up with the game by half-time and broadcast the second half direct from the field.

The same station will cover the Madison West-La Crosse Central game at 8 p. m. Saturday.

First college game to be aired by a Madison station will be the Texas Christian-Kansas battle at 1:45 p. m. Saturday, coming via ABC-WISC. Saturday's schedule also will include one pro game—Bears vs. Eagles on WIND at 6:30 p. m.

On Sunday, WTMJ will broadcast the Packers-Washington tussle at 2 p. m.

Smallest Baby Ever Born That Lived Marks First Year

CHICAGO—(U.P.)—“The smallest baby ever born that lived” celebrated her first birthday Wednesday.

Little Candice Korvel weighed one pound 7 ounces when she was born two months prematurely a year ago.

She survived an attack of double pneumonia and speedily put on weight until she now weighs 17 pounds. Children normally triple their weight during their first year.

Guests at her first birthday party included a grandmother and a great grandfather.

John Korvel, an apartment house manager, said Candice sat, stood up, and began crawling within 48 hours when she was seven months old.

He said she started eating cereals when she was three months old.

Candice has one sister, Jacqueline, 4 years old, who, Korvel said, is “extremely solicitous” over the baby's welfare.

The family doctor, who would not permit use of his name, said Candice's survival was a miracle. Dr. Morris Fishbein of the American Medical Assn. said when her chance for life was sure that she was the “smallest baby ever born that lived.”

When the University of Wisconsin football season opens, carrying one set of programs on FM, another on the AM (amplitude modulation) channel.

The university station will broadcast the Wisconsin-Marquette game on FM only at 1:15 Saturday, Sept. 24. At the same time, the AM frequency will have the usual Saturday lineup—“Taxation Today,” “Labor Speaks,” “Steuben Music Hour,” “Music of the Masters,” news, weather, and “London Column.”

Simultaneous operation will be resumed after the game.

Incidentally, WFOW probably will not carry Wisconsin football games, so you'll be hearing music on its wave Saturday afternoons.

SCHOENBERG: The Pro Arte quartet of the University of Wisconsin will include a series of Schoenberg programs in its recitals in Music Hall this season. The first will be Feb. 20.
