### Gun Wielder Sane, Doctors Say; Faces Sentence Today

Melvin Hanson, 24, who tried to shoot a Madison policeman with a stolen deputy sheriff's gun, will probably be sentenced today in superior court after being adjudged sane Thursday by three Mandota state hospital doctors. Superior Judge Roy H. Proctor said.

Hanson was sent to the hospital for examination after he pleaded guilty before Judge Proctor to two counts of assault without regard for life and a charge of burglarizing the gun from Sheriff Herman P. Kerl's garage.

Drs. W. J. Urben, the hospital superintendent, A. Soucek, and A. Coletti reported to Judge Proctor that Hanson is not feeble-minded or insane but is "an unstable man and what technically is called a psychopathic personality."

"In his thinking, he narrows his considerations to match the impulsive tendencies which result from his emotional instability, thus arriving at a pattern of behavior which is consistent and not psychotic, although socially deviant," the doctors said.

Hanson has an intelligent quotient of 112, which is considered "bright normal intelligence," the doctors reported.

Hanson forced a cab driver at gunpoint to take him to his mother-in-law's house on Spaight st., where he attempted to shoot the lock off the back door.

Later, he stuck the gun in Police Officer Kenneth Kalhagen's side and pulled the trigger, but the gun failed to fire.
