A variety show which, with the progress that often comes after a slow opening, should turn into an entertaining evening, was presented for the first time Monday night by the Junior Chamber of Commerce. The first performance was in East high auditorium, where "Now and Then" will be repeated at 8 tonight. The show will be given again at 8 p. m. Wednesday and Thursday in West high auditorium.
The first half was a contrast of new and old styles in entertainment. The second portion a minstrel show.
"Now" was introduced by Alma Baron. "Then" by Fern Thompson, and the two divisions ran a pretty close race. But yesterday edged out today about two to one, with a couple of the acts winning ties.

High spots in the competition were in solo dancing and singing. Sheila Dennis, modern tap dancer, and Gust Pates, billed as a soft-shoe stepper, topped the dance department, and Merry Stoll's singing of "A Bird in a Gilded Cage," in which she Kay-Ohed Beatrice Kay, took a close decision from Joe Washington and Mitzi Thomas in the modern division.
The audience also liked the Cardinal quartet, good as usual, in old-fashioned bathing suits, and little Jeanine Harris, soprano, and dancer.

Before and during the show, some Olsen and Johnson antics enlivened the proceedings. Coach John Walsh, for example, distributed aspirin to the audience just before the curtain went up. A. J. Fiore, Coach Willis Jones, and Jimmy Demetral also appeared in surprise spots.
The minstrel show, done in traditional style (even some of the jokes are traditions), had Harry Stoll as interactor, stooging for the end-men's ears, of which several were in doubtful taste. Merry Stoll again provided a highlight with her version of "St. Louis Blues," and Sid Wright did well with "O! Man River."
What the show lacked was speed and finish in production, polish and precision in group singing and dancing. This you can blame on the director rather than on the performers, who certainly appeared to have the enthusiasm that is needed for zip and snap.
