Ex-Ford Official Testifies in Tucker Car Fraud Trial
CHICAGO—(UP)—A government witness testified Friday that Preston Tucker once told him that if he raised money for his ill-fated Tucker Torpedo car he could "watch the world roll by" even if the car was a flop.
The witness, Arnold Peterson, former Ford Motor Co. superintendent, added however that he did not believe Tucker had fraudulent intent at the time.
Tucker and seven associates in the nearly-defunct Tucker Corp. are on trial in federal court charged with mail fraud and conspiracy. The government charges that the raising of \$28,000,000 to finance the car was a fraud.
Peterson also testified that Robert Pierce, former Tucker treasurer and a defendant in the trial, once told him that "Tucker is a crook and I'm leaving the company."
