OAK RIDGE, Tenn.—(U.P.)—Prof. Don M. Yost of the California Institute of Technology thinks that the inorganic chemist is just as much an heroic explorer in his own way as Daniel Boone and St. Patrick.

"Like Daniel Boone, he enjoys exploring both the known and the unknown and being close to earth," Yost said.
