Dr. Bull Urges Fluoride for Urban Waters

(Special to the State Journal)

SAN FRANCISCO—Immediate fluorination of all urban water supplies to prevent dental decay was urged here Tuesday afternoon by Dr. Francis A. Bull, Madison, Wis., director of dental health in the Wisconsin state board of health.

Dr. Bull reported, in a paper read before the research section of the American Dental Assn., that nine Wisconsin cities including Madison, have added fluoride to their water in a ratio of one part per million.

He took issue with research scientists who have urged that community water supplies should not be fluorinated until it is conclusively proved that artificial addition of fluoride will reduce incidence of dental decay.

He said reductions ranging from 18 to 28 per cent have been found among children at Sheboygan, Wis., since its water
