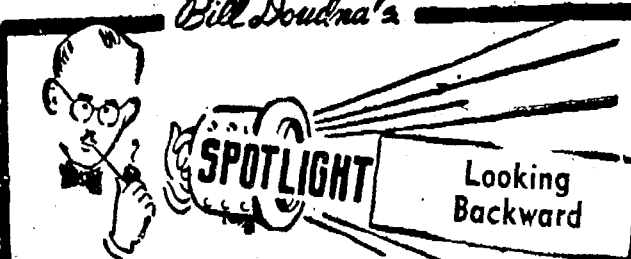

George Bernard Shaw's "The Devil's Disciple" was produced by Wisconsin Players just about 21 years ago—in November, 1928. This is the play which will open the Players' 1949-50 season at 8 p. m.

Another top role was played by Don Varian, currently director of speech and theater at the University of Akron. O. The director was Prof. William C. Troutman, who developed many of the campus' outstanding actors, and the press agent was George Schlotthauer, now a Madison attorney.

"Two fine actors" graced the play, The State Journal review said. They were Ameche and Varian. And another was "excellent in his brief appearance." That was Tompkins, who (in incidentally) played the part of Lawyer Tompkins.

Of Ameche, The State Journal said on his first campus debut: "Ameche is a new luminary on the campus, but he justified Troutman's decision in giving him the role of Dick Dudgeon ... a fine characterization."

Writing in the Daily Cardinal, Bob Godley made this observation: "With one performance, he placed himself in a class with Herman Wilka ... who is now associate professor of orthopedic surgery in the university school of medicine."

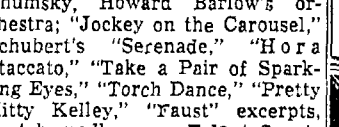

JACKSON, Miss. — (UP) — A suit in which Gladys Noel Bates, a former Jackson Negro teacher, seeks equal pay with white teachers for all of teachers of her race, will be heard in federal court here during November.

Mississippi's 8,366 white classroom teachers draw an average salary of \$1,731.05 for the 1948-49 school term, while the average for the state's 6,164 Negro teachers was \$659.49.
