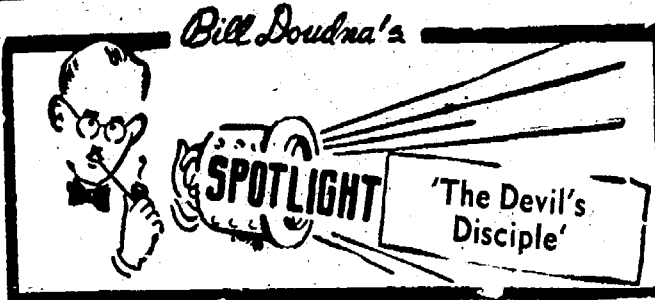

**TIP O' THE MORNING:** An entertainer who was stationed at Truxex Field and appeared often in Madison will be one of the guests on "This Is Your Life" over WIBA at 7 tonight.

Things are going right well at the Wisconsin Union theater. The concert series and the Sunday Music hours started with superlative performances. Now Wisconsin Players have begun their season with a production of "The Devil's Disciple" which, in most particulars, rates a classification as top notch.

Bruce Kanitz, Ordean Ness, Beverly Mae Muth and Robert Couture, handled the leading roles in superior fashion at the opening Tuesday night, and Fred Thompson, Edwin Morgan, and Glen Potter drew neat vignettes of lesser characters.

Except for the first act, Prof. Jonathan Curwin's direction was up to Shavian demands, and part of the fault was Shaw's for describing the work as "melodrama." Sandra Stelk, as a loud narrator of a mother, set a pace toward satire on melodrama, and the decision led Kanitz for a time into a rather stiff and mechanical interpretation of the swashbuckling hero.

But, thanks be, he overcame this tendency in his first big scene, and thereafter was at ease. Kanitz portrayed a young Maine rebel on 1777 who declared he had sold his soul to Satan, and did all he could to prove it. Given a chance to be a hero by substituting for a minister doomed to the British gallows, he took the role with gusto and bravado, incidentally falling in love with the

preacher's wife. The preacher — played by Couture — assumed the appearance of a heel, but managed to become a hero before the final curtain. Couture gave credibility to the three or four-sided character, a man who could turn from sincere and sympathetic pastor into a priggish coward, and then into a cunning soldier.

Ness was ideal as Gen. Burgoyne, the typical Shaw role into whose mouth the playwright put heavy sarcasm and a scorn for governmental red tape. At the same time, this Burgoyne was human and touched with a sense of humor not shared by his stiff-necked fellow officers, epitomized in Potter's portrayal of Major Swindon.

Miss Muth did a good piece of work as the preacher's wife, particularly in her horror-stricken belief in the pastor's cowardice and her profession of love for the Devil's disciple. It seems superfluous to add that the settings were first-rate when the program says that Fred Buerki had a hand in their design. The play will be repeated at 8 p.m. daily through Saturday.

**8 City Students Picked for UW Women's Chorus**

Eight Madison students have been chosen as members of the University of Wisconsin Women's chorus, Chairman Leland A. Coon of the university school of music announced Tuesday.

They are Jane Bandy, Betty Figler, Mary Glover, Marilyn Parish, Colette Slightam, Beverly Long, Shirley Scheerer, and Marjorie Lindle.

The 50-voice chorus is directed by Prof. Helene S-Thomas Blotz. An all-time high of 688 students has been selected for membership in the 10 organizations sponsored by the school of music, Coon said.

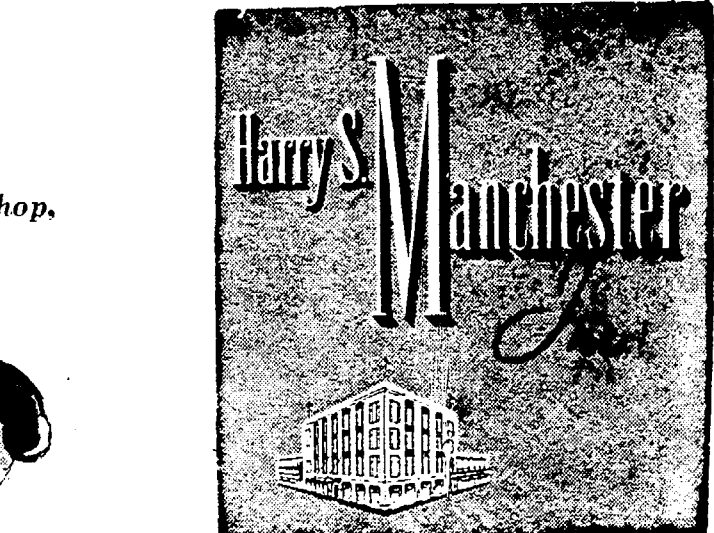
