Old Newsreels Shown Tonight

Tragedy in the sky—May 11, 1932, when the U. S. Akron, Navy Queen of the Skies, snaps a landing cable and carries three ground crewmen hanging desperately for their lives—Robert Eschbaugh, then Michael Henton, lose their grip and fall to death. One man, Bud Coward is lone survivor. This is the first episode of the third chapter of KTTV's "Yesterday's Newsreel," showing tonight at 6:30 p. m.

Paul Von Benceckendorf and Von Hindenburg, second president of the German Republic, visits Oldenberg in 1937 and lays the cornerstone for a great forum of sports in that capital city of the Grand Duchy.

Rheims, France, 1927, and a cathedral is reclaimed—the official opening of the restored, famous Rheims Cathedral, shell-torn from World War I.

Two years later, British premier Ramsey MacDonald arrives in New York and Washington for a disarmament conference. Back in 1927, when the Navy's Old Ironsides enters drydock for its first reconditioning since it was commissioned in 1833.

It's 1927—Melville, La., scene of ruin and desolation as a levee, already partly shattered by rising waters, breaks again, inundating an entire city.

Bidder With Too Many Trumps Must Overplay From Own Hand

ONE can have too many of anything, even too many trumps in a bridge hand. John Brown, an English writer, gives a good example of this in his new book "Winning Tricks," published in this country.

Brown points out that too many trumps is the declarer's problem in today's hand. The opponents cash the king, queen and jack of clubs and West continues with the ace. In order to make his contract, declarer has to find the king of hearts in the East hand. But suppose he gets a bad trump distribution—a good player will provide against that. In this case South should not trump the ace of clubs with the deuce or eight of hearts. He should trump with the ten of hearts. As Brown says, always give consid-
