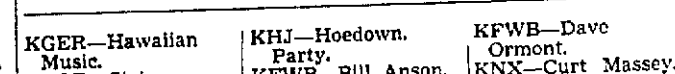

Ace, 2 Kings Sequence Bids Force Opener to Try Slam

This is the fourth of a series of articles taken from Fred L. Karpin's explanation of his ace and king showing responses to an opening two-bid in a suit. While this chapter has nothing to do with the point-count system of bidding, nevertheless it is worth your while to become thoroughly familiar with the convention, as a greater part of it has been used by many of the country's good players. It will be a rare occasion when you hold an ace and two kings opposite partner's opening two-bid. When you do you can tell him exactly what you have, thereby eliminating the guess in the hand. With today's holding, you first show the ace by bidding that suit, and on your rebid you jump to four no trump. North's response of two spades showed the ace of spades. With two aces the first response would have been four no trump. North's second bid of four no trump showed two kings, which now

For example: Opener: ♠ A 5, ♥ A 9, ♦ Q 6, ♣ A K Q 8 6 4. Responder: ♠ Q 9 7 6 3, ♥ K 8 2, ♦ A K 7 4, ♣ 3. Bidding: 2♠ (b), 4♠ (b), 7♠ or 7N.T. (d). (a) Showing the AK of diamonds. (b) Small slam now assured—looking for a grand slam. (c) Another king. (d) The grand slam—13 tricks can be counted.
