Forcing Ruff May Be Best Way to Upset Bidder's Strategy

Today's hand is a natural one for a lesson in improper play. Only too often, defensive players make the mistake of trying to stop the declarer from ruffing when forcing a ruff might be the only way to defeat the contract. In today's hand you can see that the declarer has a losing club and two losing diamonds. If he attempts to ruff his three losers for a lesson in improper play, heart trick that will establish a heart trick for the opponents. It is easy for the declarer to read this situation. However, it is a little more difficult for the opponents, but West should reason as follows: "We are vulnerable and my partner has taken me to three spades. I do not think he can do this on just four trumpes."

When I saw this hand played West won the opening lead with the king of clubs. The correct line of play is for West not to lead a heart when he wins the first diamond trick, but to return the jack of spades. This forces the declarer to ruff in dummy with the ace of hearts. Now, when East wins the next diamond trick with the ace, he can return another spade and it is impossible for declarer to make his contract.
