

Watches Slated As Awards In KTSA Show

Best Tune Guessers Get Opportunity For Rich Prizes

Some San Antonians are going to win a Gruen Curvex wristwatch from Hertzberg's for giving the names of three tunes played in the Prize Medley on the Guy Lombardo show when it debuts on KTSA at 1:30 p.m. Sunday.

Immediately following the playing of the medley, which is heard in the early part of the program, telephone calls are made to San Antonians whose names are picked at random from the local telephone directory. The first person who can correctly name the three tunes in the medley wins a choice of either a man's or a woman's 17-jewel, Gruen Curvex wristwatch.
