**Good Girls, Good Jobs: Dull Book**

"Good Jobs for Good Girls," by Harford Powell, Vanguard Press, Inc., New York, \$2.50.

Following the theme "How to renounce wage slavery and make a good man work for you," Harford Powell tries for 166 pages to be humorous in a new type of vocational guidance book. He succeeds quickly in becoming dull and repetitious.

Powell points out the man-chancing possibilities in many fields, and warns against science and teaching, "the drowsy careers." Of accounting he writes: "This is the toughest of possible scenes. It turns all the Girls into Business Machines!"
