Broadcasts from the stage of the Metropolitan Opera house will begin Saturday, Nov. 26, via the ABC network, with the same sponsor that has picked up the tab for the last nine years.

The broadcast season will open with "Samson and Delilah," starring Rise Stevens as Delilah, Ramon Vinay as Samson, and Robert Merrill as the high priest. Of these singers, two have been in Madison on the Wisconsin Union concert series in the last two years—Merrill and Miss Stevens.

The series of 18 matinees will have the intermission features which have been popular for several years — Deems Taylor's "Opera Quiz" and Boris Goldovsky's "Opera News." Milton Cross will continue as narrator.
