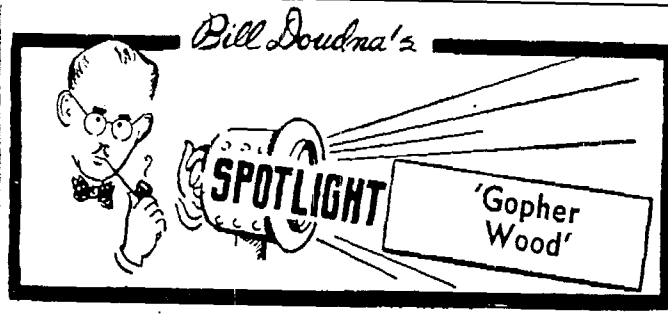

Mrs. Behariell to Aid Guild Play

Patricia Behariell, newcomer to Madison, has been appointed technical director for the Madison Theater Guild's production of "I Remember Mama." She is a former student and stage manager at the Pasadena, Calif., Playhouse. A native of London, Ont., Mrs. Behariell is instructor in stagecraft at the University of Western Ontario and technical director of the London Little Theater's summer schools. Mrs. Behariell is in charge of set design and construction for the Guild play, to be given at 8 p. m. Friday in West high school and at 8 p. m. Saturday in East high school.

Bascom theater, which for 10 years has been used rarely for plays, will reopen as a home of drama on Nov. 21 and 22, when the Wisconsin Idea theater will present "Gopher Wood."

The three act drama about shipbuilding was written by Edward L. Kamarck, regional playwright for the Idea theater. Martha Van Kleeck, another member of the theater staff, will be director. Admission will be by invitation. Closed except for lecture use since the opening of the Memorial Union's modern theater wing, old Bascom, refurbished with new drapes and electrical equipment, now becomes the place for experimental productions of the Wisconsin Idea theater. It also probably becomes the only theater in the Midwest devoted entirely to production of new plays.

The Wisconsin Idea theater was established at the university in 1945 under the leadership of Prof. Robert E. Gard. It seeks particularly to stimulate and aid people of the state in dramatics. 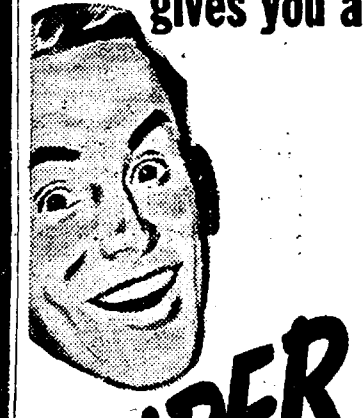
