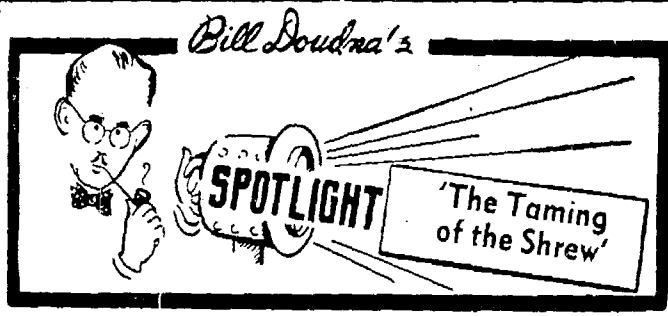

TIP O' THE MORNING: Look for George "Gabby" Hayes, bewhiskered Western character star, to headline a prairie radio show next fall. But he won't be starred. "Gabby" says his tricks aren't enough to be a topnotcher. He is searching for a new cowboy face to be "front man."

A lively, lusty, hearty production of "The Taming of the Shrew" brought Margaret Webster's troupe back to Madison Thursday night for the first of three performances. The troupe will do "Julius Caesar" at 2:30 and 8 p. m. today in the same playhouse, the Wisconsin Union theater, in which it delighted a near-capacity audience of more than 1,200 eager spectators with the highlinks of Shakespeare's rollicking farce. Everybody had fun, but nobody had more fun, it seemed, than Kendall Clark, who played Petruchio, and Larry Gates, as Christopher Sly.

This was a homecoming for Clark, for he graduated from the University of Wisconsin in 1933 and this was the first time he had been back since 1935. Meanwhile, he had been in some of Broadway's biggest hits and a frequent television performer. In "Julius Caesar," he will play Mark Antony. Clarke gave Petruchio everything in the book, and some things that he didn't realize were there via the language of inflection and gesture. A rowdy knight, a loud-booster, a noisier woman-queror one couldn't imagine. As agile as a dancer, as sarcastic as a Shavian hero, and as lively as a shortstop, he was perfectly adapted to the role, bountiful in good lines and full of opportunity for hilarious by-play.

Louisa Horton was a thoroughly good choice, too, for Katherina, the obtuse shrew whom Petruchio tamed with malicious trickery and wit. As loud-mouthed at first as Petruchio, she gradually subsided, only to turn in the play's last scene into a woman who could yell as noisily as ever but with a strange sort of humor which, one felt, was her own laughter at the futility of her first-act rantings. Miss Horton's big moments were in that scene and in an earlier one in which she bowed slowly to Petruchio's will, looking at him uncertainly to learn whether the sun or the moon happened to be out at the moment. This line and its accompanying facial action were almost worth the price of admission.

This version of the comedy gave Christopher Sly a greater importance than most. As played by Gates, he was a jovial drunk who loved every minute of his faked nobility, and he stopped frequently into the action of the play he was supposed to be watching. It's safe to assume I'm sure, that you

Microscope Improved for Cancer Study

ELLIS (United Press Science Editor) NEW YORK.—The already-powerful electron microscope has been improved to give "telescopic eyes" to the medical scientists in studying the difference between cancerous and normal cells. The penetrating "eyes" have been made possible through addition of a cutting device that will snip off a piece of human tissue about four millionths of an inch thick. The slices it would take 250,000 of them to fill an inch gap—also can be kept in order as they are sliced off, thus making it possible to reconstruct exact three-dimensional pictures of affected areas.

The new technique was described by Dr. James Hillier, of RCA Laboratories, Princeton, N. J., at an exhibit of the United Hospital fund at the museum of the city of New York. He said that the improved microscope was now in use at the Sloan-Kettering institute, which is part of memorial hospital for cancer and allied diseases. The powerful microscope which
