Video Football Games Improve

NEW YORK. Increase in the number of cameras has considerably heightened the overall effect of football television.

One of the extra cameras has been placed in the end zone to produce a head-on scene when a kick is made. Generally the other cameras, as many as three, are put at about the 50-yard line so that entire field can be spanned.

Each camera obtains closeup as well as intermediate and distance lenses so that the variety of views can be increased further.

Strong Light Produces 'Bloom'

NEW YORK. A "bloom" in television never means a flower. Rather it is the glare caused when too much light from an object is reflected into the lens of a camera.

As a result of over-brightness, the camera tube tends to obscure picture detail and a blob or dark spot is produced in the picture.

An example of this effect would be the white bosom front of a man's shirt against the background of his dark tuxedo.
