Tryouts Set for New Chain Radio Opportunity Show

Lewis, "on vacation" since he completed the summer fill-in for Arthur Godfrey, is getting ready for an audition he hopes will put him back on CBS radio and TV. The dress tryout is next Thursday. The program is mainly the idea of Lester Gottlieb, creator of Sing It Again, although some folks call it "The Lewis version of a combination of the Godfrey Talent Scouts and This Is Show Business, with ramifications." The talent will be that previously auditioned by the network either privately or on the air. The various acts will perform in the presence of special studio guests, of talent, such as night club owners, theatrical agents and others. While the show is planned as a combination presentation for radio and TV, it will be set up to fit either medium alone. With Thanksgiving week drawing to a close, the networks are turning to the next holiday. CBS radio already has announced a special for Christmas afternoon at 5 under the title of Hollywood Hour. It will be a microphone version of the religious drama, "Servant in the House." Henry Fonda will narrate for a large Hollywood cast. The sponsor is the same one who provides the Rudy Vallee Variety Hour for CBS-TV this afternoon.
