The spirit of Thanksgiving Day, 1949, will find full reflection in special programs and in holiday themes sounded by regularly scheduled broadcasts over the Columbia Broadcasting System Thursday.

During the morning, Arthur Godfrey and the little Godfreys will give thanks and make merry in their own homey way. The holiday theme will find a full hour of simultaneous sight-and-sound expression in the joint AM-TV broadcast of "Thanksgiving Day Festival" on the entire AM and TV networks of CBS, when "The Symphonette" conducted by Mishel Piastro; "The Choralliers," led by Eugene Loyell, and a distinguished array of guest talent join forces to celebrate the day in choral, orchestral, dance and pantomime performances.

"Hallmark Playhouse" presents a radio version of Henry Wadsworth Longfellow's "The Courtship of Miles Standish." "Beulah," irreplaceable housekeeper for the Hendersons, finds her Herculean efforts for the day endangered by young Donnie's boast that his family is practicing austerity this Thanksgiving.

Brilliant Pianist Has Prodigious Musical Past

Leonid Hambro, brilliant young American pianist who will be guest soloist in the hour-long radio-television "Thanksgiving Day Festival" over KTSA-CBS and CBS-TV at 4 p.m. Thursday, has a long and prodigious musical history behind him at the age of 29.

Hambro struck his first piano note when he was 2 and gave his first public performance at the age of 5. In 1933, when he was 13, he won the first of three consecutive music awards given annually by Society of American Musicians. Subsequently, he won a five-year fellowship at the Juilliard graduate school, and in 1946 he won the annual Naumberg Foundation Award. Recently, he was appointed pianist of the New York Philharmonic-Symphony Orchestra.

Hambro is a Columbia Records artist and his phonographic performances include the Prokofiev Sonata in D Major, with Violinist Joseph Szigeti. For recreation, Hambro writes jazz compositions and plays billiards. He is a former holder of the New York State billiard championship title.
